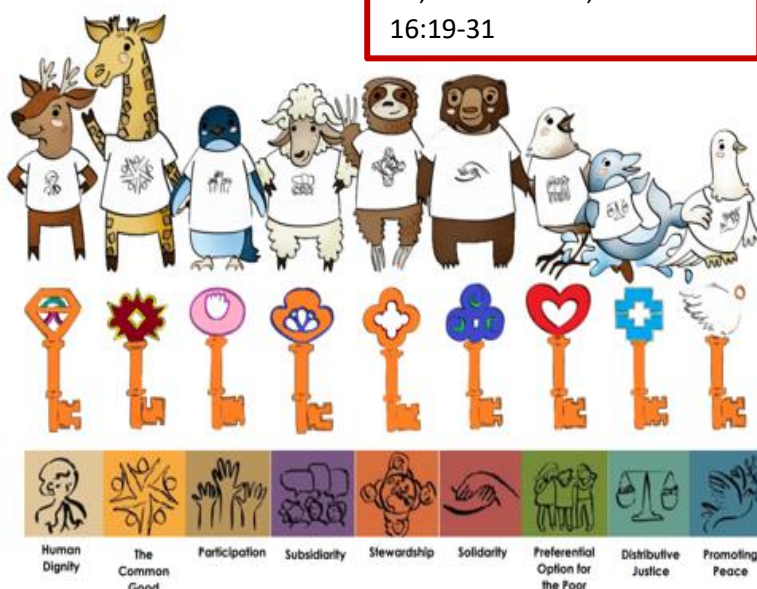
Let us pray:
